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# Welcome to the 35<sup>th</sup> annual Dancing on the Edge Festival.

As I consider this year's festival and festivals past, I cannot help but think of the connections between the two and the oh so many dance memories created over the years. Thirty-five festivals with countless magic moments!!

From Peter Bingham and Mary Scott's aerial dance work entitled **The Wall Piece** on the Firehall's courtyard wall to Gerry Morita driving an RV on to Spanish Banks then flinging open the doors to perform **RV There Yet**; from Compagnie Marie Chouinard's amazing **Les Solos 1978-1998** and the festival's presentation of their **The Rite of Spring** to the sharing of the Playhouse stage by two of Canada's dance icons, Peggy Baker (**Intimate Gestures**) and Crystal Pite (**Field/Fiction**), the festival has had a history of not always doing the expected.

While I can't possibly mention all the wonderful dance works created over the years there are many ties in this festival to those who were here in the first and throughout. They are joined by many new dance visionaries for audiences to enjoy.

The 35th festival opens with the Canadian premiere of Wen Wei Dance and ADARTE COMPAGNIA 's Barocco **Rave**. Wen Wei's work has been a part of the festival for many years and the beauty of his work **TAO** still resonates in my mind. And the festival closes with work from Josh Beamish's MOVETHECOMPANY and Company 605's Lisa Mariko Gelley and Josh Martin. Marc Boivin and Sarah Chase create dance magic at the Scotiabank Dance Centre with **The door opened** west. New to the festival, to Vancouver and not to be missed is Montreal's Parts+Labour Danse in a powerful and unpredictable solo work flirting with our search for solitude and our fear of being alone. Method Dance from Prince George and Mocean Dance from Halifax join together on EDGE Four to offer two different but connected perspectives on the power of water and our need to respect that very power. Joe Laughlin danced in **Solitude** at the first festival and he is back this year with I Remember..., a piece exploring an aging dancer's body and how

that informs his work now. Kokoro's Wreck Beach Butoh takes to the beach and Mascall Dance takes to the streets with dance in a pick-up truck with Privilege at Home. Old friends like Meredith Kalaman, plastic orchid factory, and Vanessa Goodman join with those new to the festival. Edmonton's Good Woman Dance Collective, Montreal's Fila 13 Productions and independent artists Ashvini Sundaram & Yui Ugai; Keira Shaw & Sophie Dow; Alyssa Favero and Emmalena Fredriksson join in to create a dynamic and diverse range of choreographies that will stimulate audiences kinetically and emotionally.

The Dancing on the Edge Festival would not be possible without the support of our venue and presenting partners – SFU Woodward's Cultural Programs, The Dance Centre, Left of Main and New Works. A big shout out to them; to the Festival's public funders and sponsors; festival staff and volunteers and to the artists for their passion, creativity and drive.

In this powerful and theatrical solo, David Albert-Toth explores our innermost paradoxes. Our thirst for solitude flirts with our fear of being alone, and our infinite desires remain eternally unfulfilled.

Co-choreographed with, and directed by Emily Gualtieri, David is in turn dancer, actor, and magician: a self-undermining virtuoso. The choreographic duo summons the myth of Tantalus and revisits it with the complicity of playwright Étienne Lepage. On stage, David speaks to us with irreverent humour about the

absurdity of our primal desires, and of the unspeakable things we are ready to do to satisfy them. He taps deeply into his uncommon, writhing physicality, through trial and error, crystallizing into form and force in fleeting moments. The work is unpredictable, imbued with ambivalent and conflicting desires. As the body shifts through states playing against the duo's intricate choreographic writing, the piece invokes a global experience of vulnerability, scrutinizing the modern-day individual and, by extension, each one of us.



Wreck Beach Butoh has been performed annually by Kokoro Dance for the past twenty-eight years. It is one of our favourite performances but also a test of the stamina and spirit of the performers who participate in a 2-week 5-hour/day workshop during which they learn a 60 to 70 minute work that is performed with set, music, and lighting by Mother Nature. The performances are in the nude apart from white body-makeup that the dancers apply to erase their egos.
